


Second Sunday of Advent: John Says Yes December 7, 2025

THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM

Blessed are you, holy God. You are the creator of the waters of the earth. You are the fire of rebirth. You poured out your Spirit on your people Israel. You breathe life into our dry bones. Your Son Jesus promised to send the Spirit to us that the world may know your peace and truth.

In this Advent season of waiting and watching, you call us again to turn toward you, to be washed of all that weighs us down, and to live as people shaped by your grace. Pour out your Holy Spirit, and breathe new life into those baptized. By your Spirit adopt us all as your children, through our Savior Jesus Christ, our Advent hope, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Gracious God, you called John the Baptist to say "yes" to your wild and urgent call— to prepare the way, to speak truth, and to invite your people to turn toward life. Open our hearts to hear that call today. Give us courage to say "yes" to your Spirit, to repent of what harms, to bear fruits of justice and mercy, and to make room for Christ's coming among us and within us. Through Jesus Christ, the One who is coming and is already here. **Amen.**

The Word

Isaiah describes the coming of a future, ideal ruler who will renew David's royal line (the stump of Jesse). Gifted by the spirit of God, this ruler will reign with perfect justice. Enmity and danger will be restored to harmony and peaceful coexistence.

A reading from Isaiah 11:1-10.

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse;

from his roots a Branch will bear fruit.

The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him—

the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding,

the Spirit of counsel and of might,

the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the Lord -

and he will delight in the fear of the Lord.

He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes,

or decide by what he hears with his ears;

but with righteousness he will judge the needy,

with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth.

He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth;

with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked.

Righteousness will be his belt

and faithfulness the sash around his waist.

The wolf will live with the lamb, the leopard will lie down with the goat,

the calf and the lion and the yearling together; and a little child will lead them.

The cow will feed with the bear, their young will lie down together,

and the lion will eat straw like the ox.

The infant will play near the cobra's den,

and the young child will put its hand into the viper's nest.

They will neither harm nor destroy

on all my holy mountain,

for the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the Lord

as the waters cover the sea.

In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his resting place will be glorious.

The word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

John challenges the religious leaders (Pharisees and Sadducees), warning them that true repentance must bear good fruit, not just rely on status or heritage. He announces that someone greater than he is coming: Jesus.

The gospel according to Matthew 3:1-12.

Glory to you, O Lord.

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.' "

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him, and they were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.

But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Therefore, bear fruit worthy of repentance, and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

"I baptize you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

This is the gospel of our Lord.

And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.


INVITATION TO THE TABLE
